The fire basket with triangular cut-aways to sturdy front fire bars and a trefoil shaped fireback with central lattice-work circular panel and partial flower detail. Manufacturer of basket: Hart, Son, Peard & Co.

William Burges (1827-1881) was a prominent English architect and designer, known for his contributions to the Gothic Revival movement. His work is characterized by its romantic and picturesque style, often incorporating elements of medieval and Gothic architecture. Burges' designs were highly influential, and his work continues to inspire architects and designers today.

This fire basket serves as a reminder of the artistic and technical achievements of the era and the enduring legacy of William Burges.
